for the Sum of 15,165 *l.* Sterling, clear of Brokerage and other incident Charges; and that by the said Account, there was then 24,650 *l.* capital Stock, in the Bank of *England*, belonging to this Province, which cost 29,877 *l.* 4 *s.* Sterling, and the Sum of 15,795 *l.* 12 *s.* 8 *d.* Sterling, in the Hands of the said Trustees: That of the Bills drawn by the late Commissioners for the Purpose of sinking the Bills of Credit, there was still then unpaid one Bill of 637 *l.* 16 *s.* Sterling, which had not been presented: That the Commissioners for emitting Bills of Credit have, pursuant to the Directions of the Act of Assembly, emitted 300,000 Dollars, in Bills of Credit: That they have received, from sundry Sheriffs, the Sum of 1566 *l.* 15 *s.* current Money, for Ordinary Licenses, and have drawn on the Trustees in *London*, the Sum of 14,861 *l.* 14 *s.* Sterling, and on *William and Mary Hunt*, the Sum of 470 *l.* 6 *s.* 10 *d.* Sterling, in Bills of Exchange to sundry Persons: That they have received from *Jonathan Smith*, Executor of *Peter Bayard*, the Sum of 188 *l.* 5 *s.* current Money, and for Interest on one Bond, the Sum of 1 *l.* 7 *s.* 6 *d.* Sterling: That the said Commissioners have lent out to sundry Persons, on Bonds, which have been produced to your Committee, the Sum of 83,407 *l.* 14 *s.* 7 *d.* Sterling: That they have paid away, for printing the Bills of Credit, 1000 Dollars, and for Office Expences, in Bills of Credit, to the Value of 18 *l.* 13 *s.* 5 *d.* Sterling, and for their and their Clerk's Salaries, 550 Dollars, and that there remains in the Office, in Gold and Silver, the Sum of 499 *l.* 7 *s.* 1 *d.* Current Money, as by the following State will appear.

Your Committee have farther to observe, that by a Report in *November* Session 1765, it appears that the Sum of 73 *l.* 17 *s.* 2 *d.* current Money was then due from the Collector of the Land Tax for *Queen-Anne's* County, for the Half Year, ending the 29th of *September* 1763, and that the said Sum hath not yet been paid in. Your Committee take Leave to observe, that there is in the Office, in Bills of Credit, 18,000 Dollars, to be signed and delivered in Exchange for torn and defaced Bills.

All which is submitted to the Consideration of both Houses of Assembly, this 29th Day of *October* 1770.
