ROB EDEN THEREAS the Right Honourable Henry Harford, Esq; abs v'ute Lord and Proprietary of the Province of Maryland, by his Commission under his greater Scal at Arms, bearing Date at London the Second Day of March, Anna Domini Seventeen Hundred and Seventy-three, has, with the Approbation of his most facred Majesty, been pleased to constitute and appoint me, the said Robert Eden, Lieutenant General and Chief Governor of the Province of Maryland; which said Commission was this Day published in the Presence and Hearing of the Members of the Lord Proprietary's Council, and others the King's Subjects and Lord Proprietary's Tenants in this Province, at the City of Annapolis: I have, therefore, by and with the Advice of the Lord Proprietary's Council of State, thought fit to issue this my Proclamation, notifying the same to all Sheriffs, Magistrates, and others the Lord Proprietary's Officers in this Province. And I do further will and direct, that all Officers civil and military, holding their several respective Offices by Virtue of Comzissions in the Name of, or under the Authorities and Powers derived from, the late Frederick Lord Baltimore, deceased, renew forthwith such Commissions, under Pain, on Omission thereof, of being removed or discharged, or their respective Commissions being superseded or determined.
