Hall, Mr. Johnson, Mr. Chaje, Mr. Paca, Mr. T. Wright, Mr. Thomas, Mr. Beall, Mr. Hammond, Mr. So. Wright, and Mr. Chamberlaine, do prepare and bring in the same.

On Motion, Ordered, That Leave be given to bring in a Bill for the Independency of the Justices, the Enlargement of the County Court Juristiction in Cases of Equity, and the Authority of Deputy Commissaries; and that Mr. Pasa, Mr. Hammend, Mr. Chamber Laine, Mr. Beall,

Mr. Bond, Mr. Chaje, and Mr. Wortton, do prepare and tring in the fame.
