this Province of Maryland, on the Sixteenth Day of March, Sevention Hundred and One-Tute was " enacted by legal and conflictutional authority," and therefore is in full Force and Virtue. If, upon a dispassionate, and meture Confideration, you should not deem it improper at this Time, when buits are depending on the Validity of the Act of 1701-2, for either or buth Houses to publish their Sentiments on the Question, as they may tend to influence the Determinations of the Courts, we shall be ready to enter into a full Discussion of the Subject, on your Communication to us of the Reasons wrich may have induced you to entertain the Opinion, that the " Act of 1701-2 was not enacted by legal and conflictational Authority, and is " therefore vold."

We are not only persuaded that the declared Foundation of your Bill is entirely desective, but also that the Provisions of it, aiming to establish an Equality in the respective Incomes of the Ministers, would, if admitted, impose an unequal Tax on the People, and opposestive on such, as refide in some of the smaller Parishes, as well as damp the emulous Exertions of Meric which the Hopes of Preferment are wont to animate.
