nurpose have actually collected an armed force, and by erecting the flandard of the king of Great-Britain, have invited the common enemy into their gountry; in compassion therefore to Those unhappy and deluded people, and to prevent the effusion of kindred blood, the General Affembly have issued this proclamation, exhorting them to return to a due obedience to the laws of their country, and requiring them to disperse immediately, and within forty days from the date hereof, to repair to the commanding officer, at such times and places in the counties of Somerset and Wordester as he shall direct, and then and there deliver up to the persons appointed to receive them, all their fire and fide arms, and take the gath of allegiance and fidelity to this fixte, prescribed by the form of government. Upon a strict compliance with these conditions, it IN HEREBY DECLARED, and the PUBLIC FAITH SOLEMNLY PLIGHTED, that the offenders aforefall fhall not only be pardoned for all the above offences and for all others of the like nature heretofore committed against this state, but be protected by the laws, authority, and power thereof, and lecured in as full and ample enjoyment of their religious and civil rights, as any of its other inhabitants; and MOREOVER that their grievances (if any) shall be heard and speedily redreffed. But as an example to others, and to prevent such dangerous and unwarrantable combinations in future, the perfons, whose names are hereunto annexed, are excepted from any benesit or advantage, which they might otherwise have claimed by virtue of this proclamation.

INSTRUCTIONS by the General Affembly of Maryland, to brigadier-general Small-

General Smallwood is to take with him the Virginia regiment of regulars, the company of teguiars commanded by captain Deams, the company of regulars commanded by captain Godman, the independent company from Baltimore-Town commanded by captain Steret, together with the Annapolis independent company commanded by captain James Brice, and a detachment of matrofles, from Annapolis and Baltimore town, with two field pieces, commanded by lieutenant William Campbell, and with all expedition proceed to Somerset and Worcester counties, and there publish and difficure the proclamation issued by authority of the general assembly, and see the same duly enforced, and use his utmost endeavours to apprehend all the several persons excepted out of the Taid proclamation.

Should be find any difaffected persons assembled in arms, he is to use his utmost endeavours to equell them, shedding no blood if possible to avoid it, and taking care to arrest the leaders, and send them under a guard to the executive power of this state, by them to be disposed of accord-

ing to law. That general Smallwood shall be at full liberty and is hereby instructed to dismiss from this fervice the Virginia regiment, and all the regulars on the continental establishment, as foon as he judges they can be spared, and all the militia and other troops as soon as the service be ended. He is to give intelligence of his proceedings from time to time to the executive body of this

State.

That general Smallwood give the necessary orders for securing the arms of the insurgents in Somerset and Worcester councies, and pursue the directions he may hereaster receive from the executive power of this state, as to the disposition of those arms.

Which was read, and the question put, That the house concur with the same? Resolved una-

nimoully in the affirmative.

ORDERED, That a copy of the above be delivered by the conferees of this house to the conferees of the senate.

The proclamation and instructions were engrossed and signed by the honourable speaker.

The house proceeded to ballot for a governor, and the ballot box being prepared, the ballots were deposited therein, when the committee appointed by this house to join the committee of the senare to take the joint ballots of both houses revived to the conference room, and after some time the gentlemen return and report to the house, that on examining the ballots of both houses, the numbers stood as follow: For Thomas Johnson, junior, Esquire, 40; Samuel Chase, Esquire, 9; Manchew Tilghman, Esquire, 1; George Plater, Esquire, 1; William Paoa, Esquire, 1. Thomas Johnson, junior, Esquire, is therefore declared governor of the state of Maryland. The house adjourns till to morrow morning 9 o'clock.
