WE-earnot immediately conour in the joint recommendation of a general officer, proposed in your message of this day by Messieurs Ridgely and Bordley, because we conceive the recommendation would be premature at present, as the information which seems to have occasioned your message is very impersect, and contained in a private letter written by one delegate only, addressed solely to your speaker, and solicits merely the sentiments of your house; were the letter less exceptionable in these respects, yet as it plainly refers to some intelligence not yet communicated even to your house, we think the recommendation of a general officer should be delayed till the intelligence comes regularly authenticated to the general assembly.
