state, shall take the oath of fidelity and allegiance to this state, and repeat and sign a declaration

of his belief in the christian religion."

Add to the bill the following claufe: "And be it enacted, That the general and county courts within this state, shell at all and every of their courts, give this act in charge to the grand juries of their respective courts."

R. POTTS, cl. fen. By order, The amendments being read, ORDERED, That the same be taken into consideration at the

meeting of the house this afternoon.

The house met. Mr. Parran appeared in the house.

The house taking into consideration the amendments proposed by the senate to the bill, entitled, An act to punish certain c imes, &c. unanimously rejected the first and second amendments,

agree to the third, and reject the fourth.

The house agree to that part of the fifth amendment which relates to striking out the appointment and powers of the committees of observation, and that part which invests the governor (with the advice of the council) with particular powers, and directs a suspension of the habeas corpus in case of invasion, and reject the remainder.

The house agree to the fixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, and eleventh amendments.

The question was put, That the house agree to the twelfth amendment, which is as follows: After the word " law" in the 15th line of the 13th page, strike out all the remaining part of the clause which follows in these words," is or he may discharge him on paying two dollars to the perion who shall apprehend him, and twelve ninetieth's of a dollar for every mile from the place he shall be taken, to the house of the judge, justice, or member of the committee, or such judge, justice, or member of committee, may commit such person till payment, but if discharged he shall give such person a pass;" " and insert the following:" " and if not an offender, or dangerous as aforesaid, the said judge or justice may discharge him, and give him a pass?" Carried in the negative.
