On motion, That the governor be requested to afford the said William Goddard the protection of the law of the land, and to direct the justices of Baltimore county to give him every protection in their power against all violence or injury to his person or property? an amendment was proposed, as follows: To strike out the words "the said," and alter the word "Goddard" to insert "and every other inhabitant of Baltimore county," and insert "them" instead of "him." On which amendment the question was put, and carried in the negative.
