In progression on the said bill, the question was put, That the following clause, " And be it enaffed, That all tobaccoes in the several warehouses, at the time of affessment, shall be valued by the several assessors in whose hundreds such warehouses shall respectively be, and the rate of assessment shall be notified to the several inspectors, who are hereby authorised and required to receive such assessment before the tobaccoes he delivered out, except only in case of tobaccoes purchased for the use of this state, the United States, or any of them, or where it shall appear, by the oath or affirmation of the party, or the testimony of some indifferent witness, that the same tobaccoes have been already assessed; and in case any inspector or inspectors shall deliver out such tobaccoes after notice of such assessment, without receiving the money due for the assessment aforesaid, he shall be liable to pay double the value of such assessment, to be recovered before a single magiftrate on complaint made of such neglect, and the magistrate shall render account of and pay the money so recovered to the sheriff of his county, for the use of the public," he struck out?
