per cent. payable in three years after the date of such certificate. Provided that no certificate thall issue for less than one hundred dollars; and the said certificates shall be discountable at the option of the holder out of the next affessioent to be made, for the benefit of the public.

RESOLVED, That the interest be paid annually by the treasurer of the eastern or western shore who gave the certificate, or shall be discountable at the option of the holder out of the assessments

to be annually made, for the benefit of the public.

Resorver, That the governot and the council be authorised and empowered to appoint a comselflary and deputy commillaries, if need be, to procure supplies of blankers, shoes, stockings, flires and other cloathing, and also a reasonable quantity of spirituous liquors, for the comfortable sublisheres of the officers and soldiers of the several battalions raised or to be raised for the quota of this state in the continental army, and that such commissary have the power to dispose of the faid articles to the officers and foldiers, in fuch proportions as the commanding officers from this state, commanding in the army, shall direct, and at such reasonable prices as shall be assessed by the cloathier general, or his deputy, and in just proportion, as near as may be, to the wages of the officers and foldiers, charging the furplus of the cost to the united states. And

That the governor and the council take effectual measures to prevent any competition between the purchasing agents of this state, and the cloathier general or his agents. And that the agents few this state observe the instructions of the governor and the council, from time to time, relative

to the prices of cloathing purchased within this stare.

ORDERED, That the further consideration of the articles of confederation be postponed till Monday morning.

-The petition of Saul Ward, and other inhabitants of Somerfet county, was read and referred till the next fession of assembly.

The house adjourns till to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.
