away of the said sum (including his own salary from the 28th day of May to the 28th day of October last) as appears by vouchers to us produced and examined, the sum of \mathcal{L} . 12,625 0 5\frac{3}{4}; and that he also paid in exchange for bills of credit emitted in July, 1775, which are counted and destroyed, the sum of \mathcal{L} . 519 10; and that he has now remaining in his hands the sum of \mathcal{L} . 10,257 13 4\frac{3}{4}, carried to the credit of this state.

Your committee also lay before the house for their perusal the journal of accounts, closed by resolve as of Friday the 19th instant, including an allowance to jurymen and others for services done under the late government, amounting in the whole to £. 6,501 17 9. All which is sub-

mitted to the confideration of the honourable house.
