That it appears by the accounts of the said commissioners, there has become and still remains due, from sundry persons on the beforementioned bonds, to the 26th day of January, 1778, the sum of £. 202 18 8 sterling for interest.

That it appears to your committee, the commissioners have received out of the £ 52,950, emitted per act of assembly, November session, 1773; and lent out on bond to sundry persons, the sum of £. 2,782 10 sterling, in discharge of the principal of several bonds, and also the sum of 1,314 9 4 for interest, from the 4th of June last till the 26th of January, 1778; which sums the said commissioners have, in compliance with a resolve of the house of delegates, paid into the hands of the western shore treasurer, as per receipt produced to your committee appears.

That your committee have examined the several bonds of that emission which remain in the office, and compared the same with a list thereof, now remaining ready for the inspection of both houses, amounting to the sum of £. 50,167 10. That it appears by the accounts of the said commissioners, there has become and still remains due for interest on the beforementioned bonds, to the 26th of January, 1778, the sum of £. 993 1 sterling.

That your committee have examined the state of the 31,333 1/2 dollars, emitted to be lent out on interest for the use of the poor in Baltimore county, and for repairing the public roads in the several counties, and find by a report in June last, there was then a balance of £. 1,493 4 1 remaining in the office on that account. That the commissioners have since received from the supervisors of the public roads in Baltimore county the sum of

That the commissioners have paid away out of the above sums, to the order of the trustees of the poor in Baltimore county, the sum of

And that there remains in the office a balance on the above account, amounting to the sum of

That no interest has been accounted for to the commissioners on the abovementioned sums, but that your committee have examined the necessary voucher and receipt for the payment of the above sum, and find it to be right.

That it appears to your committee, by a report in June last, there was then remaining in the office, out of the 80,000 dollars emitted for payment of public claimants, a balance amounting to £. 984 11 10 1/4.

That the commissioners have since paid away to Thomas Smithson, on journal, the sum of

For which payment, have been produced to your committee the necessary voucher and receipt; and that there remains in the office a balance on the above account, amounting to

That out of the above balance of £. 978 15 8 1/2, there still remains due to the sundry claimants on the journal of accounts, passed at November session, 1773, the sum of £. 428 7 2 currency.

That the said commissioners have paid away to sundry persons, out of the 122,707 1/8 dollars, the balance per last report of the 133,333 1/2 dollars, emitted to exchange torn and defaced bills, the sum of 769 1/2 dollars, which your committee have counted and burnt, and that there now remains in the office, for the purpose of changing torn and defaced bills, the sum of 121,938 dollars.

That it appears to your committee by the last report, there had been received for interest on the 235,333 1/2 dollars, the sum of £. 4,066 18 2 sterling, and that the same now remains in the office, appropriated for the purpose of erecting a college or seminary of learning.

That your committee find, by a report in June last, there was then a balance of £. 740 5 11 1/2 gold currency, in the office, received from the trustees and naval offices, on account of the light-house on Cape Henry, and that the same still remains in the office, consisting of 42 oz. 9 dwts. 19 grs. gold, and the residue in bills of credit.

That in order to give the honourable houses some general idea of the different emissions, and the funds for sinking the same, your committee beg leave to subjoin the following account.
