The bill, entitled, An act for the payment of the journal of accounts, was read the second

time, palled, and fent to the fenate by Mr. Strawbridge and Mr. Stevenson.

Matthew Tilghman, Etq; from the tenate, delivers to Mr. Speaker a letter from his excellency Henry Laurens, Liq; president of congress, of the 20th instant, enclosing an act of congress of the 17th, for cutting off all correspondence between the enemy and the people of the United States; which was read, and ordered to lie on the table.

Charles Carroll, bartifler, Esq; from the senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker a petition from Solomon Bird; of Somerlet county, and a petition from fundry inhabitants of Baltimore county, severally endorted; "By the fenate, June 22, 1778: Read and referred to the confideration of the

66 house of delegates:

" By order, R. RIDGELY, cl. fen." The perition of Solomon Bird was read, fetting forth, That he was confined in Dorchester

county gaol, on tufpicion of his being an enemy to his country, during the time prescribed for taking the oath of fidelity and support to the state; that during his faid confinement he took said oath, and intagined he had thereby complied with the law, but being still chargeable with the treble tax, prays to be admitted to take the same in the county where he resides, that he may thereby ie relieved from the payment of the faid treble tax.

The petition of Richard Gold, San uel Coale, and thirty-nine other subscribers, inhabitants

of Baltimore county, praying to be admitted to take the oath of fidelity, &c. was also read.

A petition from Catherine Shipley, wife of George Shipley, and George Shipley, jun. and Talbot Shipley, tons of the faid George Shipley, of Anne-Arundel county, being prefented to the house and read, setting forth, That the said George Shipley, for many years past, has been deprived of his reason, and has not taken the oath of sidelity and support to the state, and therefore praying that he may be relieved from paying the treble tax, and the facts fet forth appearing to be true, RESOLVED, That the faid petition be granted.

Ordered, That Mr. William Hopper, theriff of Caroline county, attend at the bar of this house, on the third day of the next session of assembly, to shew cause why he did not duly make his return of the election of a delegate to represent said county, in the room of Mr. Henry Downes, who refigned. ORDERED, That the fergeant at arms ferve the faid William Hopper

with a copy of the above order.

On motion, That a committee be appointed to draft a message to the senate, requesting them to disclose to this house the reasons which induced them to dissent to the bill, entitled, An act to declare the law, &c. the question was put, and passed in the affirmative.
