

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, JUNE, 1778. 141

The amendment to the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of certain nonjurors, was read and assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Thomas Jennings, Esq; from the senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker a message, which was read in the words following:

By the SENATE, June 23, 1778.

Gentlemen,
HAVING nearly finished the business of this session, we do not know any thing to prevent our rising this day. We therefore think proper to inform you, that the first Monday in November next is the time to which this house propose to adjourn.

The engrossed bills, No. 8, 9, were severally read and assented to, and, with the paper bills thereof, sent to the senate by Mr. Gibson and Mr. Williams.

Matthew Tilghman, Esq; from the senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker the paper bills, No. 8, 9, severally endorsed; "By the senate, June 23, 1778: The engrossed bill, whereof this is the original, read and assented to.

Matthew Tilghman and Charles Carroll, barrister, Esqrs. from the senate, acquaint Mr. Speaker, that the governor is attending in the senate, and that the attendance of this house is requested there immediately, that the engrossed bills may be signed and sealed in presence of the members of both houses. Mr. Speaker left the chair, and, attended by the other members, went to the senate, and there presented the following engrossed bills to the governor, who signed the same and affixed the great seal thereto, in presence of the members of both houses.

- No. 1. An act relating to prisoners and deserters from the British army and navy.
- No. 2. An act to aid the proceedings of the commissioners of the tax, and for other purposes.
- No. 3. An act to prohibit, for a limited time, the exportation of wheat, flour, rye, Indian corn, rice, bread, beef, pork, bacon, live stock, and other victual.
- No. 4. An act concerning the gun-lock factory in Frederick-Town in Frederick county.
- No. 5. A supplementary act to the act, entitled, An act for King William's school, in Annapolis.
- No. 6. A supplementary act to an act, entitled, An act for the special appointment of inspectors, and other purposes.
- No. 7. An act to continue an act, entitled, An act for enlarging the powers of the governor and council.
- No. 8. An act for the payment of the journal of accounts.
- No. 9. An act for the relief of certain nonjurors.

Mr. Speaker (with the other members) returned and resumed the chair.

This house adjourns to the 3d day of October next.

So end the proceedings of this session, this twenty-third day of June, anno domini 1778.
