By the COMMITTEE of CLAIMS.

YOUR committee have procured from the treasurer of the western shore a state of the treasuty and loan-office, by which it appears, that a balance of about fifty-nine thousand poun remains in the treasury, and twenty-eight thousand three hundred and fifty pounds in the loan-office, the whole amounting to eighty-leven thousand three hundred and fifty pounds.

That fitty thousand dollars thereof are set apart by order of the governor and council towards complying with the first quarterly payment, according to the late requisition of congress, which

will leave a halance of fixty-eight thousand fix hundred pounds.

Your committee are informed that about twenty thousand pounds remain in the eastern shore

treasury.

It also appears by the state asoresaid, that one hundred and fifty-five thousand three hundred and thirty-seven pounds eleven shillings and eight pence hath been received for loan office certificates, by the weitern shore treasurer. That certificates have also issued to the amount of eleven thousand three hundred and twenty pounds, agreeable to an act of assembly, entitled, An act for the payment of the journal of accounts, &c. and that the annual interest arising on the certificates as above issued, is nine thousand nine hundred and ninety-nine pounds nine shillings and twopence, which, with what may have been received on loan by the eaftern shore treasurer, and what may be taken up by persons in the several counties appointed to receive money for state certificates, will, in the opinion of your committee, take a greater part of the taxes of this state than is confishent with prudence or good policy. And as there seems to be a sufficient sum in the treasury to answer any demand thereon that is likely soon to be made, your committee are of opinion, that the treasurers, and other persons appointed to receive for the state, ought to be directed not to receive on loan any further sums for the use of this state. All which is submitted to the consideration of the honourable house.
