in virtue of which guardianship, Samuel Dorsey had the direction of the whole, but he dying, Edward Dorsey, minor, choic another guardian, on whom devolved the sole management of the aforefaid furnace, the operations of which, by particular appointment, are subject to the orders and direction of those of the owners only who possess at least a share of two fixths. The case being thus circumstanced, and Margaret Dorsey having property in one fixth part only, finds herself unable to comply wish the contract entered into by Daniel of St. Thomas Jenifer, Esq. on behalf of this state, and her deceased husband, in conjunction with a certain John Onions, a person employed to superintend the above surnace, and no part owner. Your committee considering the peculiar circumstances of her case, think her prayer reasonable, and that she is justly entitled to the savour of this house. All which is submitted to the consideration of the honourable house.
