The resolve of yesterday by Robert Goldsborough, Esq; from the senate, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate by Mr. Stevenson and Mr. Hammond.

The bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act for the better security of the government, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by Mr. Bowie and Mr. Brown.

Mr. Maccubbin brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of certain nonjurors therein named, which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill for the relief of Robert Darnall and others, were read and agreed to, and the bill passed for engrossing.

The declaration reported by the committee of both houses of the general assembly, was read the second time, and the question was put, That the house concur therewith? Resolved in the affirmative.
