THE committee to whom was referred the letter from his Excellency the Governor of the 2d of August, relative to the expences of recruiting-officers, and the claims of the officers in the matross companies in the city of Annapolis and Baltimore-Town, beg leave to report, that in the opinion of your committee, the officers who have been engaged in the recruiting service should be reimbursed by the state their expences while engaged in that business, at least whatever sums they may have (not extravagantly) expended over and above their pay as officers. Your committee further beg leave to observe, that there does not appear to them to be any just grounds for discrimination between the officers in the matrols companies and the continental officers, as to the allowance made by this state for cloaths and other necessaries, and are of opinion that they ought to be placed upon the same sooting. All which is submitted to the consideration of the honourable house.
