RESOLVED, That the governor and the council be authorifed and empowered to draw on the treasury for a sum of money sufficient to surnish the sailors and marines, now in the service of this state, with rum and tobacco upon the same scale of proportion that hath been already allowed to the foldiers belonging to this state in the continental army.
