

Thursday November 11th 1779

The House met. Present as on yesterday except Mr. Morris who hath leave of absence. Monday next. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Burgess hath leave of absence for a few days. The petition of Samuel Caldwell, and the petition of the magistrates in Cecil County, were severally read and ordered to lie on the Table.

The Memorial of Thomas Brooks Hodgin was read the first and second time by special Order, and referred to Mr. Henry, Mr. Hanlon, Mr. Quayn, Mr. Chase and Mr. Wootton who are appointed a Committee to enquire into and report thereon.

The Bill entitled An Act concerning Nonjurors was read the second time and committed for Amendments.

A Letter from Col. Uriah Donist, Auditor General, to the honourable the Speaker, was read the first time and ordered to lie on the Table.

The petition of Samuel Caldwell was read the second time whereupon it resolved, That the Council be desired to request his Excellency General Washington, or the commanding Officer at Elizabeth Town, to grant his audience to Mrs Grizzle Tagart with her three Children to go into the City of New York, and to the said Samuel Caldwell to attend them, and to return; and that the Council be requested to grant their pass for the said before to repair to his Commander in Chief, or to his Commander at Elizabeth Town, to obtain leave as aforesaid.

Mr. Wootton brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the Bill, entitled, An Act concerning Nonjurors with Amendments; which was read the first and second time by special Order, passed, and sent to the Senate by Mr. Chase and a Mr. Doye.

Charles Carroll, Barrister, Esq; from the Senate delivers to Mr. Speaker a petition of the Inhabitants of William and Mary Parish in Charles County; a petition of Ignatius Haden and Mary his wife, setting forth, That Mary Haden heretofore married with a certain William Macman, deceased, who at his Death left two Daughters; that the said William Macman was educated in the Church of England Religion, and his posterity in the Roman Catholic Religion; that the Petitioner Mary hath since intermarried with the other Petitioner Ignatius Haden; that since the last Intermarriage, the Orphans Court have taken away the Children from the Petitioners, and appointed Guardians to them, under the Act, entitled, an Additional and Supplementary Act to the several Acts for the Administration of Justice in Testamentary Affairs; and therefore praying that an Act may pass, empowering the judges of the Orphans Court to appoint the Petitioner Ignatius Haden, Guardian to the said Children; a petition of William Moore, a petition of Jasper Kennish, a petition of Charles Dowler and William Mattingly, Nonjurors; severally endorsed; "By the Senate November 11th 1779 Read and referred to the Consideration of the House of Delegates.
