Friday November 19th 1779

The House met, Present as on Yesterday. The Proceedings of Yesterday were read. Mr. Ringgold
appeared in the House. A Letter from Charles Ramsey, Lieutenant of Cecil County,
enclosing a petition of Cornelius Bradley, Thomas Armstrong and Alexander Armstrong,
was preferred and read, and referred, together with the petition to the Governor and
Council to take Order thereon.

Mr. Deym brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a Bill, entitled, An Act to enable the
Corporation of the City of Annapolis to sell certain Lands, to lay a further Tax on Property
within the Said City and its Precincts, to regulate and license Ordinaries and Retailers
of Spirituous Liquors within the said City and the Precincts thereof which was read the
first Time and ordered to lie on the Table

The Bill, entitled, An Act relating to the Estates of deceased Persons was read a second
Time in Part and committed for Amendments.

Agreeable to the Order of the Day the House resolved itself into a Committee of the
whole, Mr. Hanson in the Chair, and after some Time spent therein Mr. Speaker resumed
the Chair. Mr. Hanson reported, that the Committee had, according to Order, taken into their
Consideration the subject matter referred to them, but not having had Time to go through
the same, had desired him to move for leave to sit again. Resolved, That this House will, at
three O'Clock this Afternoon, resolve itself into a Committee of the whole, to consider further
of the same. The House adjourns till 3 O'Clock
