 for the Enrollment of Deeds. Ordered, That Mr. Hale, Mr. Chase, Mr. Lethbrury, Mr. W.
 Stevenfon, and Mr. McMichin do prepare and bring in the same.
 The Petition of Ignatius Hazen and Mary his Wife, agreeable to the Order of the Day, was
 read the second Time and rejected.

The House adjourns till to Morrow Morning 9 O'Clock

Saturday November 20th 1779

The House met. Present as on Yesterday, except Mr. Grosham, Mr. Hammond and Mr. Hale.
 The Proceedings of Yesterday were read. Mr. Henry Dennis, a Delegate returned for Worcester
 County appeared, and after being duly qualified, he took his Seat in the House.
 Mr. Jordan hath leave of absence for ten Days.

The Report by Mr. Lethbrury of the 10th Instant, and the Draught of the Address to the late
 Governor were severally read, the Report concurred with, and the Draught of the Address
 reported. Sent to the Senate by Mr. J. Hanfon, and Mr. J. Henry

The Bill, entitled, An Act to prevent the raising License and Swine in the Town of Cambridge
 was read the second Time passed, and sent to the Senate by Mr. Smoot and Mr. Eccleston.
 The Bill, entitled, A Supplement to the Act for the Establishment of select Vestries, was read
 the second Time, passed, and sent to the Senate by Mr. Craufurd and Mr. Ringgold.

The Bill, entitled, An Act to compel the Attendance of the Members of the General Assembly,
 was read the second Time, passed, and sent to the Senate by Mr. Lethbrury and Mr. Magruder.

The Bill, entitled, A Supplement to the Act, entitled, An Act to make the Bills of Credit issued
 by Congress and the Bills of Credit emitted by Acts of Assembly and Resolves of the late
 Conventions a legal Tender in all Cases, was read the second Time, and the Question was
 put That the said Bill do pass? The yeas and Nays called for by Mr. McComas appeared
 in the Affirmative
