17 72 currency remaining in his hands.

That it appears to your committee, by the account of faid treasurer, he hath received on

loan, for which state certificates have been issued, the sum of f. 507 12 6.

Your committee find, that the said treasurer hath paid away, for interest on state loan-office certificates £.277 5 5. It also appears to your committee, that said treasurer hash paid away, including his salary to the 8th of November, 1779, the sum of £.35,872 18 3; for all which sums have been produced to your committee the necessary vouchers and receipts; and that there remains in his hands a balance of £. 4,859 6 51 belonging to this flate.

Cramphin, and Mr. J. Hanson, do prepare and bring in the same. The bill, entitled, An act relating to the county courts of Caroline county, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by Mr. Driver and Mr.

M'Bride.

The proceedings of the commissioners from the several states of New-Hampshire, Massachusetts, Rhode-Island and Povidence plantations, Connecticut, and New-York, held at Hartford on the 20th of October, 1779; and the letter from William Livingston, president, and Caleb Camp, speaker of the house of assembly of New-Jersey, dated Trenton, September 29, 1779; reserved to Mr. J. Hanson, Mr. Sprigg, Mr. Chase, Mr. J. Henry, Mr. J. Hall, Mr. W. Stevenson, and Mr. Fitzhugh, who are appointed a committee to confider and report on the same.
