THE house met. Present as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill for the relief of nonjurors. ORDERED, That Mr. J. Hanson, Mr. Den, Mr. Chase, Mr. Lethbury, Mr. W. Stevenson, Mr. Keene, and Mr. Job, do prepare and bring in the same.

On progression on the second reading the bill for seizure, &c. the question was put, That debts due to British subjects be excepted, and not made liable to seizure and confiscation? Resolved in the affirmative.

The house adjourns till 3 o'clock.
