Mr. Hall brings in the faid bill, with the following clause as an amendment:

" And be it enucted, That the jurisdiction of the magistrate out of court shall be encreased to the fum of fifty pounds currency or the value thereof in fterling at four and fix-pence per dollar, and that the same tum shall be recovered in the manner heretofore directed by the act, entitled, An act for the speedy recovery of small debts out of court, passed at a session of assembly, begun and held at the city of Annapolis, on the sixteenth day of June, one thousand seven hundred and seembly.
