Deye, do prepare and bring in the fame.

Mr. Fitzhugh brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act to revive and aid the proceedings of Calvert county court, and for other purposes therein mentioned; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A memorial of the vestrymen and churchwardens of Christ-Church parish in Calvert county, praying that the house would re-consider the report of a committee appointed the last session to enquire into the expence incurred in consequence of an opposition to the petition of fundry inhabitants of Calvert county, in favour of the reverend Francis Lauder, and award such costs as may be thought just and reasonable, was preferred and read, and referred to Mr. Fitzhugh, Mr. Gaunt, Mr. Mackall, and Mr. Smith, who are appointed a committee to consider and report on the same.
