Mr. Fitzhugh, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the following report:

THE committee, to whom was referred the letter of the 2d of June from the committee of co-operation, beg leave to report, that they have taken the same into consideration, and come to the following resolutions:

1. That it is the opinion of the committee, that this state ought to exert every possible means in its power to surnish the monthly supplies required by the committee of co-operation, of slour, beef, and grain for forage, to commence the first of July, and to continue, if necessary, until the last of November, and to obtain the quantity of bacon monthly to the last of September, and to procure the number of draught horses, and waggons, with sour horses and harness complete to each waggon, to be delivered before the first of July.

2. That it is the opinion of this committee, that the monthly expence of procuring the flour, beef, and grain, will be above one million of pounds, at the present prices, in continental currency, as appears by the following estimate, viz.
