On motion, That the committee appointed to ascertain the proportion of recruits to be raised by each county for filling up the regiments of this state, be directed to proceed, in ascertaining the said proportion, agreeable to the number of militia in each county, giving credit to each county for such number of their militia as have been enlisted by the recruiting officers appointed by the governor and council; the previous question was called for and put, That the said question be now put? Resolved in the affirmative.
