William Hindman, Esq; from the senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, A Supplement to the act to procure recruits to complete the battalions of this state in the service of the United States, and to raise an additional regiment if necessary, endorsed; "By the senate, June 30, 1780: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Joseph Sim, Esq; from the senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker the bill, entitled, An act concerning nonjurors, endorsed; "By the senate, June 28, 1780: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Which was ordered to be engrossed.

The report on the petition of John Caile Harrison being read the second time, on motion, the question was put, That the petition of John Caile Harrison be so far granted, that all those who are not already paid for their provisions be allowed to discount what may be due to them in their present or future assessment; and that the said petitioner be assured, that he shall be paid for what he himself has advanced, as soon as the state treasury will admit, with interest for the same, and that he return an account on oath to the sheriff or collector of the county of the balances outstanding; and that the pork be immediately delivered to the order of the governor and council? Determined in the negative.

Mr. Cadwalader brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act regulating the mode of payment of debts and tender of the same in certain cases; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A petition from Ignatius Hardman, of Charles county, praying to be relieved from the payment of the treble tax, and all other disabilities incurred by his not taking the oath of fidelity to the state, was preferred and read, and the petitioner's name ordered to be inserted in the bill for the relief of certain nonjurors.

ORDERED, That the petition of George Medley be referred to Mr. Key, Mr. Mackall, Mr. Smith, and Mr. Bayly, to consider and report thereon.

The house adjourns till to-morrow morning 8 o'clock.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The commissioners for stating and settling the public accounts, agreeable to the order of yesterday, made a report; which was read.

On a second reading of the bill, entitled, A Supplement to the act to procure recruits to complete the battalions, &c. the question was put, That if the recruits to be furnished by particular counties be not procured by a day to be assigned, there shall be a draught in such county for the men that are deficient, such draughts to serve until the last day of December next; such classes who find men to be exempt from the draught?
