Your committee further report, that on the 20th day of July last, the governor and council directed the treasurer to draw a set of bills of exchange for L. 1500 kerling, on the trustees, which bills the governor and council transmitted to Mr. Johns Johnson at Nantes, and directed him with the said bills, if paid, to purchase and thip, at the risk and for the use of the state, 500 suits of soldiers cloathing; 2000 pair of stockings, 1000 hats, and 1000 pair of copper shoe-buckles. That on the fourth of this present month, the governor and council directed the treasurer to draw another set of bills of exchange, for L. 1500 sterling, on the trustees, which was also transmitted to Mr. Joshua Johnson, for the purpose of purchasing cloth and linen for the officers and soldiers of this state, and for the purchase of 200 muskets and 500 bushels of salt.

Your committee beg leave further to report, that of the bills of credit emitted in virtue of the act for the payment of the public claims, there was brought into the treating of \$12.3 ferling, for which bills of exchange were drawn on the truitees, and \$1.417.5 5 currency, for which certificates were issued agreeable to the act for calling out of circulation certain bills of credit, passed at November session 1779; and there remains \$1.53,201, 19 currency of the said

bills of credit, not brought in, agreeable to the faid act, by the hit of June laft.

Your committee also report, that the governor and council wrote the 4th of January last so Benjamin Franklin, Esq; at Paris, enclosing the powers appointing trustees to sell the bank stock, and transmitted copies, but have received no answer thereto. They also at the same time wrote to John Jay, Esq; at Madrid, who acknowledges receipt of said powers.

All which is submitted to the confideration of the honourable house.
