The question was then put, That the house concur with that part of the said report relative to the salary of the deputy treasurer? Determined in the negative.

The question was then put on £. 250. Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, That the house concur with that part of the report relative to the salary of the treasurer's clerk? Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, That the house concur with that part of the said report relative to the salary of the treasurer of the eastern shore? Resolved in the affirmative.

W E D N E S D A Y, December 20, 1780.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Gaunt. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The memorial of Henry Hollingsworth and Ebenezer Booth was read the second time, and referred to Mr. Job, Mr. T. Johnson, Mr. Chamberlaine, Mr. Lawson, and Mr. Quynn, to consider and report thereon.

The house resumed the consideration of the report on the civil list, and that part of the said report relative to the allowance to delegates to congress being read, the question was put, That the house concur therewith? Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, That the delegates to congress be allowed £. 4 per day? Resolved in the affirmative.

Those parts of the said report relative to the salary of the clerk of the court of appeals and the fee bill, were read and concurred with.

Mr. Kent, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the following report :

THE committee, to whom was referred the letter of Mr. Addison, beg leave to report, that in their opinion Mr. Addison nor his son has any right to expect, nor ought to have permission, to return to this state; that as he, at the commencement of this dispute with Great Britain,

chose
