" And any citizen of this state, who hath taken the oath, or affirmation, of fidelity and support aforesaid, and hath and shall accordingly exert himself in support thereof as aforesaid, whose property on the land in this or either of the United States has been or shall be taken from him by the enemy, or whose houses or other property on the land in this state hath been or shall be burnt or otherwise destroyed by the enemy, or whose unrigged vessel in this state has been heretofore destroyed by the enemy, or whose unrigged vessel in this state shall hereafter, within twenty days after her being launched, be taken away, burnt, or otherwise destroyed by the enemy, shall, on shewing and proving the same to the legislature, be indemnished, either in the whole, or rateably and in proportion, so far as British property, or the value thereof, shall extend, after the payment of the debt due to this state on account of the bank stock as aforesaid, and debts due from British subjects to the citizens of this state; and if the value of British property shall not be sufficient for all the said purposes, then shall the citizens, whose lands or other property has been or shall be confiscated as aforesaid, and the citizens who have suffered and may suffer by their property being taken or destroyed as aforesaid, be let in for their indemnity and satisfaction, equal to the balance of the value of British property, after the payment of the debts aforesaid."
