Your committee are of opinion, that the faid Joseph Baxter ought to be relieved from the interest of twenty per cent. on his public account, and that he ought to have credit for his faid account, agreeable to the real depreciation at the time when the balance due from him should have been paid; and your committee are further of opinion, that the sum of two hundred and eighty-five pounds fifteen shillings and fix-pence, due on account of prisoners of war and deferters, ought to be charged to the United States.

Your committee beg leave further to report, that they have examined the facts fet forth in the petitions of Clement Beall, late theriff and collector of Montgomery county, Simon Nicholls, now theriff and collector of faid county, and Thomas Williams, theriff and collector of Prince-George's county, and find the facts stated in said petitions to be true, and are of opinion that the faid petitioners ought to be relieved from the twenty per cent. on their public accounts.

All which is submitted to the consideration of the honourable house.
