The returns from the commissioners of Calvert county being of a very extraordinary nature, we beg leave to refer the house thereto.

It is stated by the commissioners of Dorchester county, that as Benjamin Keene and Henry Keene had been, from comfortable livings, reduced to a state of want, and as William Barnes, Alexander Douglass, and Valentine Barnes, had greatly suffered by the depredations of the enemy, they the said commissioners had suspended the collection of their assessment until the pleasure of the general assembly should be known.

By the returns from the commissioners of Anne-Arundel county it appears, that the collection of the assessment on the following property taken by the enemy has been suspended, viz.

By the returns from the commissioners of Prince-George's, Anne-Arundel, Dorchester, Kent, and Somerset counties, it appears, that they have relieved several nonjurors from the treble tax in their respective counties, in the doing of which it appears to your committee, that the said commissioners have governed themselves by the spirit and intention of the act relating to the treble tax imposed on nonjurors and absentees.

That by the returns from the commissioners of Caroline and Washington counties it appears, that the said commissioners have relieved a considerable number of nonjurors in their respective counties from the treble tax, a part of whom are, in the opinion of your committee, properly relieved under the act aforesaid, but that in relieving others of the said nonjurors, your committee are of opinion the said commissioners have not had the least regard to the spirit and intention of the said act. Your committee are of opinion, that the commissioners of Caroline and Washington counties aforesaid ought to be directed to make other returns more correspondent to the meaning and intention of the act aforesaid.

All which is submitted to the honourable house.
