

Your committee also find, that the said treasurer hath paid away to April inclusive, the sum of £. 468,685 1 2; and that he hath exchanged the sum of £. 394,068 14 9 continental, convention, and old Maryland bills of credit (which remain in his hands) for £. 9,851 14 4¹/₂ new continental state bills, credited in new account, and also a balance of £. 11 5 specie; since which he has received from James Round Morris, clerk of Worcester county, the sum of £. 2 0 8; from John Page, late collector of Kent county, £. 265 6 13; from William Hemley, lieutenant of Queen-Anne's county, £. 28 2 6; and from William Whitely, lieutenant of Caroline county, for militia fines, £. 140 7 11; all in the new emissions; also from John Page, late collector of Kent county, £. 656 12 11 convention money; from William Hemley, lieutenant of Queen-Anne's county, £. 45 7 6 convention, and £. 3,362 12 6 continental money; and from Thomas Hayward, clerk of Somerset county, for 1780, £. 0 10 convention, and £. 117 continental money, which were received by order of the special council. And your committee find, that the said treasurer hath charged the state with £. 3 2 6 continental currency, due him per account settled January last, and hath paid away to the 5th of June inclusive, £. 10,543 12 7 in the new emission, which leaves a balance in his favour of £. 256 0 10¹/₂ in said emission, and is carried to the debit of the state in new account, and there remains a balance due to the state of £. 4,179 0 5 convention and continental money, and £. 11 5 specie, credited in new account; since which it also appears, that he hath received from sundry collectors the sum of £. 10,637 18 2¹/₄ specie, and also the sum of £. 6,057 13 9; and from Nathaniel Kicketts, inspector in Kent county £. 15 2 6 of the new emission; and further, from George Truitt, collector of Worcester, by order of the special council, £. 1,722 5 10 continental and convention money. And your committee find, that the said treasurer hath paid away to sundries, to the 16th of June inclusive, £. 10,637 18 2¹/₄ specie, £. 5,572 16 3 in the new emission, which with £. 500 new emission and £. 11 5 specie, allowed him on account of his salary now due for 1781, balances that account, exclusive of £. 5901 6 3 continental and convention money, which remains in his hands and is still due to the state.

Your committee have also examined said treasurer's account of tobacco, and find that he hath received from sundry collectors, including the 10 per cent. in crop tobacco, 455,569¹/₂ lb tobacco, and on loan 1,598 lb tobacco; and it appears that the said treasurer hath accounted for and paid away all the tobacco by him so received, and that for all the payments in the several accounts the necessary vouchers and receipts have been produced to your committee.

Your committee further beg leave to report, that by said treasurer's books there appear to be due from sundry collectors the following sums of money and tobacco, viz.

The treasurer informs your committee, that the commissioners of Queen-Anne's county have made no return to him of the first £. 10 tax, September tobacco tax, and the second £. 10 tax; that he applied to the sheriff for them, who alleged that the commissioners never called upon him to settle, but has paid on account of the above assessments 172,959¹/₂ lb tobacco, and £. 120,286 6 10 money.

The commissioners of Dorchester county have made no return for the tobacco tax, but James Woolford has paid on account 54,392¹/₂ lb tobacco.

The collectors of Worcester county say there are no inspectors, which has prevented their collecting the tobacco tax; and John Dashiell, late collector of Monie and Menokin hundreds, in Somerset county, and John Williams, of Anamessex hundred, and George Waters, of Pocomoke hundred, say they did not undertake to collect the tobacco tax, and no returns thereof are made by the commissioners, as there were no inspectors in said county until lately; and in Kent county there is no inspection house. The treasurer also informs your committee, that the collector of Cæcil county offered to pay him 56,286 dollars continental, and £. 1572 12 1 convention
