Resolved in the affirmative. ORDERED, That Mr. Scott, Mr. Lemmon, Mr. Hall, Mr. Chafe, and Mr. M'Mechen, do prepare and bring in the said bill.

Mr. Chafe, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the said bill; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Samuel Hughes, Esq; from the senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker the bill to explain and amend the act for the better security of the government, endorsed; "By the senate, June 25, 1781: "Read the first and second time by especial order and will pass.
