THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. Mr. Chew, Mr. Duckett, Mr. Wilton, and Mr. Hall, appeared in the house. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

On hearing and considering the excuses offered by Mr. Chew and Mr. Wilton, for departing without leave, the house accepted thereof.

Mr. Wilton, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the following report:

By the COMMITTEE, appointed to enquire into and report the quantity of pork, beef, wheat, wheat flour, and tobacco, collected or raised in virtue of the act passed last October session, to raise the supplies for the year 1781, &c.

YOUR committee have, in consequence of their appointment, examined the accounts of the collectors for the several counties with the treasurer of the western shore, for the collection of the supplies for the year 1781, and find there has become due from said collectors on that account the sum of 47950 13 2 real money; that the said collectors have accounted with the treasurer for the sum of 34598 1 5, and that there still remains a balance due on said account the sum of 17739 12 7, as appears by the following state of the accounts:
