On examination of the evidences against Mr. Chafe, the question was put, That this house will hear evidence of purchases made by Mr. Chafe, or by his partners, of grain and flour, between the 24th of August and the month of November 1778, as circumstantial evidence of his having been guilty of the charge alleged against him of betraying the secret resolve of congress? Resolved in the affirmative.
