Charles Carroll, Barrister, Esq; from the senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker a letter from major general Smallwood, of June 4; a letter from Robert R. Livingston, secretary of foreign affairs, of May 14; and a memorial from William Aisquith, setting forth, that he, with Hugh Hoptain William Hicks, on the administration of the estate of colonel William Hebb, deceased; that the said William Hicks removed from this to Great-Britain in the year 1759, and before he had completed the administration of the said estate, or paid over the residue thereof to the heir at law; that Edward Fenwick and Anne his wife, which Anne is the daughter and coheir of the said William Hebb, deceased, having brought suit in the general court against him, for the recovery of her dividend or proportion of the said William Hebb's estate, obtained judgment thereon, at October term 1781, for £. 696 15 currency, and 76,700^{lb} of tobacco, and costs of suit; that execution of judgment will be issued against him, in which case he will be obliged to part from all the property he has in the world to satisfy it, and his family will be reduced thereby to beggary; that he is informed that the said William Hicks has land and effects in this state sufficient to indemnify him, and praying to be granted a reasonable time to raise the money due on the judgment out of the property of the said William Hicks, and to suspend the operation of said execution till some future day; severally endorsed; "By the senate, June 4, 1782: Read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

Henry, Esq; from the senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker a memorial from sundry inhabitants of Baltimore-town, setting forth, that they have long laboured under great inconveniences from the want of a law to pitch and pave the streets of said town, that the streets are now become so intolerable, as to require the aid of a law to appoint proper persons for the express purpose of levelling, pitching and paving the same, and to enable them to raise, by a moderate annual tax on the property of the citizens, such sums of money as may be necessary to effect a business of such general utility, and praying a law may pass, authorising a board of commissioners, to be appointed from the citizens of the town, to be invested with powers to levy any tax not exceeding three-pence current money per pound upon all the property within said town, as may be justly liable to such taxation, to be applied for the purposes aforesaid, endorsed; "By the senate, June 4, 1782: Read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.
