THE committee to whom was referred the petition of Mr. Conrad Theodore Wederstrandt, beg leave to report, that they have enquired into the facts set forth in said petition, and find them to be truly stated, viz. That the petitioner was appointed an assistant commissary of purchases by Ephraim Blaine, Esq; deputy commissary-general of purchases, and approved of by the governor and council of this state; that commissioners authorized by an act of the general assembly, passed November session 1779, did seize 7996 $\frac{3}{4}$ bushels of wheat, which the petitioner had purchased for the use of the continent, as appears by the certificates herewith delivered in, signed by said commissioners; and it appears to your committee, that the said certificates, audited by Zephaniah Turner, Esq; auditor-general, amount to £. 5182 0 9 specie, due by this state to the petitioner, which sum, your committee are of opinion, should be placed to the credit of the United States, as paid by the petitioner, and that he, the said petitioner, should have a certificate from this state to that purpose, to enable him to settle his account with the United States. Which is submitted to the honourable house.
