On motion by Mr. Dashiell seconded by Mr. M'Mechen, the question was put, That the judge of the admiralty be allowed one hundred and ninety-five pounds current money for the current year? Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. B. Worthington seconded by Mr. Weems, the question was put, That the judge of the admiralty be allowed one hundred and fifty pounds current money for the current year? Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Job seconded by Mr. Chase, the question was put, That the treasurer of the western shore be allowed four hundred pounds current money for the current year? Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Forrest seconded by Mr. Job, the question was put, That the treasurer's deputy of the western shore be allowed two hundred and fifty pounds current money for the current year? Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Forrest seconded by Mr. Quynn, the question was put, That the messenger to the governor and council be allowed one hundred and twenty-five pounds current money for the current year? Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Weems seconded by Mr. Edwards, the question was put, That the messenger to the governor and council be allowed seventy-five pounds current money for the current year? Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Forrest seconded by Mr. S. Worthington, the question was put, That the messenger to the governor and council be allowed one hundred pounds current money for the current year? Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Job seconded by Mr. Quynn, the question was put, That the clerk of the senate and house of delegates be allowed each one hundred pounds current money for the current year? Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Forrest seconded by Mr. Dashiell, Leave given to bring in a bill to settle and pay the civil list, and other expences of civil government; and Mr. Forrest, Mr. Dashiell, and Mr. Kent, were appointed a committee by Mr. Speaker to bring in the same.

Letters from the secretary of war, of the 9th of August and 14th of October; from the secretary for foreign affairs, of the 12th and 15th of September; from the financier, of the 2d, 9th, 29th, and 30th of July, 12th and 20th of September, and 5th, 21st, and 23d of October; from the president of congress, of the 27th of January, 24th of June, and 20th of July; and from the secretary of congress, of the 4th of November; were laid before the house and read.

A petition from John Beaver, of Baltimore county, was preferred and read, and referred to the committee of grievances.
