Amendments proposed.

Page 2. In the fixteenth line, after the word " profits," insert, " and to pay the balance of the profits of the said estate, after deducting all charges authorised by this act, to the said Mary Ensor, or her legal representatives, annually and every year during the continuance of their truft."

Page 2. Strike out from the word " and" in the 3d line from the bottom to the end of the page: Page 3. Strike out from the word " ward" in the 7th line to the end of the clause, and infert, " and any person or persons appointed trustee or trustees in virtue of this act, may also sue in his, her or their names, and, on recovery, the faid truffees, or the survivor of them, shall hold the property so recovered in trust, according to the intention of this act."

Page 3. After the word " mortgage" in the 9th line, insert the word " mortgages."

Page 3. Add the letter "s" to the word "mortgage" in the 15th line.

Page 3.
