

The bill concerning the stock of the Bank of England belonging to this state, was read the second time by especial order and passed. Sent to the senate by Mr. Barnes and Mr. Shaw.

Mr. Hall, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the following report:

THE committee appointed to consider the memorial of William Paca, Isaac Perkins, and William Embleton, beg leave to report, That they have enquired into the facts therein set forth, and find that Lloyd Dulany was seised in tail of several tracts of land in Kent county, which were sold to the memorialists, by the commissioners for the preservation and sale of confiscated British property, some time in the month of August last, agreeable to the late act of assembly, for the life of the said Lloyd Dulany, and the continuance of the heirs of his body; and that before the said sale, to wit, in the month of June preceding, the said Lloyd Dulany was dead without issue, and consequently the state, at the time of the sale, had no forfeited interest in the said lands; and therefore your committee are of opinion, that the bonds passed by the said memorialists, for the purchase money of the said entailed estate of the said Lloyd Dulany, ought to be cancelled and delivered up to the said memorialists. All which is submitted to the honourable house.
