

shore, 17,521 16 8 specie, 4,361 3 1 in bills of credit emitted the 10th of May 1781, 1,863 0 3 in bills of credit emitted the 8th of June 1780, 90 0 0 in continental state money, and 3,362 13 9 in old continental, convention, and acts of assembly money of this state; from the Intendant of the revenue, 11,464 13 0 specie; for fees in the court of admiralty 40 10 4; for escheats and caution on land certificates 3,090 6 5; from sundry persons on account 105 15 0 specie; for confiscated property 21,205 12 6 in bills of credit of the emission of May 1781, 685 19 9 in bills of credit emitted June 1780, 79 17 8 in bills of credit emitted 18th March 1780, and 2,091 10 11 specie; from the collectors of the tax of the several counties 1,538 2 3 in bills of credit emitted June 1780, and 3,366 11 3 in continental state money on account of the 7/6 fund tax, 3,362 6 4 in bills of credit May 1781 on account of the 3/9 fund tax, and 4,669 3 10 in said bills on account of the specific tax, 3,035 5 6 specie for the 5/ tax, and 552 4 3 on account of the specific tax in 1782, 9 594 10 0 specie on account of the 5/ tax, and 8,060 9 8 on account of the specific tax for 1783. That it also appears to your committee, the said treasurer hath received from the naval officers, for tonnage and duties, &c. 28 2 4 red money, 80 9 3 in bills of credit emitted June 1780, 173 16 8 in continental state money, and 6,024 0 1 in specie; for ordinary licences 16 16 11 in bills of credit emitted May 1781, 799 19 1 in bills of credit emitted June 1780, 358 5 0 continental state money, and 133 5 0 in specie; for marriage licences, 356 8 0 in bills of credit emitted June 1780, 119 19 0 continental state money, and 91 5 0 specie; for fines and forfeitures, 2 4 10 red money, and 0 2 10 in bills of credit emitted June 1780; for commissions of letters of marque, 70 0 0 continental state money, also 77 0 0 in said bills in exchange for 3,080 1 3 old continental money, at the rate of one of the former for forty of the latter.

That your committee find certificates agreeable to the act to adjust the debts due from this state have been issued to sundry persons, to the amount of 17,109 17 7; certificates agreeable to the act proposing to the citizens of this state creditors of congress on loan-office certificates, amounting to 42,572 6 10; and certificates for the payment of the journal of accounts, paid sundry claimants, to the amount of 3,188 11 3. That certificates issued according to the acts of assembly of this state, have been discounted with the collectors thereof, to the amount of 134 8 0 continental currency, and 10,086 1 0 specie, on account of taxes; and that officers and soldiers certificates, amounting to 11,417 18 6 have been received for and on account of confiscated property sold for their redemption.

That your committee have counted and burnt the sum of 5,324 1 5 of the bills of credit made by an act of assembly June session 1780, 4,335 9 5 of the money made by congress 18th March 1780, 33,645 9 11 of the bills of credit made by an act of May 1781, and the further sum of 282 12 6 of the bills of credit made by the acts of assembly and resolves of the convention of this state.

That it appears to your committee, by the accounts of the said treasurer, he hath paid away, from the 10th of May last to the 3d of December 1783 inclusive, the sum of 55,518 4 4 specie, for all which payments have been produced to your committee the necessary vouchers and receipts, and that there remains in the office a balance of 6,890 8 5 specie, appropriated in the following manner, viz.

That it also appears to your committee, there is in the treasury the sum of 8,850 0 0 of the money made by congress 18th March 1780, it being part of the 1-10th of the bills of credit which became issuable in exchange for old continental money, and appropriated for the purpose of calling out of circulation the bills of credit emitted by the acts of assembly and resolves of convention of this state, and the farther sum of 3,614 8 4 in said bills, paid in on account of British creditors, which sums remain unapplied.

Your committee have examined the accounts of tobacco with said treasurer, and find, by an account settled by the committee of claims the 10th of May last, there was a balance of 1,205 hogsheds of crop tobacco, weighing 1,189,673 pounds, and 156,216 pounds of transfer tobacco, remaining in the treasury; also 328,130 pounds of transfer tobacco in the hands of the commissioners of the tax of the several counties.

That it appears to your committee, there hath been received from Key and Forrest 13 hogsheds, weight 12,549 pounds; from Maurice Simons 5 hogsheds, weight 4,810 pounds; from
