THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The petitions of Henry Dickinson and wife, Robert Peter, William Deakins, junior, Charles Beatty and John Threlkeld, and sundry members of the presbyterian church and others, were read.

The memorial of Richard Spencer, of Kent county, and the counter petition thereto, were read.

The petition of Henry Dickinson and wife, was referred to Mr. G. Scott, Mr. Wright, Mr. Digges, Mr. Lethbury, Mr. M'Mechen, Mr. Fraizer, and Mr. Quynn, to consider and report thereon.

The memorial of Richard Spencer, and the counter petition thereto, were referred to Mr. Wright, Mr. Joseph Dashiell, Mr. Lethbury, Mr. G. Scott, and Mr. J. Scott, to consider and report thereon.

The petition of Amos Garrett, of Harford county, was referred to Mr. Quynn, Mr. M'Mechen, and Mr. G. Scott, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Johnson brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Eleanor and Charlotte Frazier; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The report on the petition of James Rumsey, was read the second time and concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto.

Mr. Oneale brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act to invest James Rumsey with an exclusive privilege and benefit of making and selling new invented boats on a model by him invented; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill to appoint a trustee to take care of the person and property of George Shipley, senior, who is insane, was read the second time and passed. Sent to the senate by Mr. Courcy and Mr. Gibson.

A petition from sundry inhabitants of Anne-Arundel county, praying an act may pass, to establish a warehouse on South river, at a place called the Inspecting-house Point; was preferred and read, and referred to the committee appointed to bring in a bill to regulate the inspection of tobacco.

The resolution authorizing the governor to draw a sum of money for the purpose of procuring the portrait of our illustrious general, and the message relating thereto, were sent to the senate by Mr. Courcy and Mr. Gibson.

ORDERED, That the bill for the benefit of Eleanor and Charlotte Frazier have a second reading on Monday fortnight, that the parties have leave to be heard by counsel at the bar of this house, and that they have notice thereof.

The report on the petitions of sundry inhabitants of Frederick county, referred from the last to the present session, was read and concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto. **ORDERED**, That Mr. Swingle, Mr. Carey, and Mr. Hall, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. John Scott, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act to establish a market at the market-house in Chester-town, in Kent county, and for the regulation of the said market; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The report on the petition of Samuel Treahern and others, was read the second time and concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto.
