## To the honourable the GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

THE intendant of the revenue having examined the contract made by Matthew Ridley, Eq. on behalf of the state of Maryland, with Messieurs Vanstaphorsts, and having also perused

the letters, accounts, and papers, relative to this transaction, begs leave to report, That it appears by the aforesaid agreement No. 1, I hat Messieurs Vanstaphorsts obliged themselves to furnish Mr. Ridley with three hundred thousand gilders, or so much more as might be received by them by the first of January 1783 at farthest. That to the first of February 1783, they had only furnished Mr. Ridley with 111,663 gilders 12 stivers and 8 doits; that in all that month they advanced 8,333 gilders 16 stivers, in March 35,511 gilders 8 stivers, in April 17,600 gilders 1 stiver, in May 22,040 gilders 13 stivers, in June 9,529 gilders 6 stivers, in July 34,433 gilders 1 stiver, and in August 11,908 gilders 13 stivers, making in the whole to the 21st of faid month 250,420 gilders 3 stivers, the interest thereon to the first of sentember 1882 and 1882 a September 1783, 7,108 gilders 7 flivers, with commission and brokerage, as charged by Mes-
