## T H U R S D A Y, December 30, 1784.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The petition of John M'Lure, of Baltimore-town, was read and referred to the committee of claims.

The bill for the relief of Robert Long, was read the second time and passed.

Mr. De Butts, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act for altering the time of holding the courts in the counties therein mentioned; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Oneale brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act for an addition to George-town in Montgomery county; and a bill, entitled, An act to enable James Hunt to convey to William Deakins, junior, a lot of ground called Church of Scotland Lot, in exchange for other land; which were read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The report on the petition of the justices and sundry inhabitants of Frederick county, was read the second time, concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto. ORDERED, That Mr. M'Mechen, Mr. Beatty, and Mr. Quynn, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Joseph Dashiell, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a report on the petition of Anne Stevenson; which was read the first and second time, concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto. ORDERED, That Mr. G. Scott, Mr. Cadwalader, and Mr. Joseph Dashiell, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill to establish funds to secure the payment of the state debt within six years, was sent to the senate by Mr. Key.

The bill for the relief of Robert Long; the bill to vest certain powers in the intendant of the revenue; the bill to authorize the sale of part of the land of Thomas Alexander Brooke; and the bill to provide a fund for the relief of the widows and children of the clergy of the protestant episcopal church; were sent to the senate by Mr. Joseph Dashiell.

Mr. Cadwalader, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act for founding a college on the western shore of this state, and constituting the same, together with Washington college on the eastern shore, into one university, by the name of The University of Maryland; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On the second reading the said bill by especial order, the question was put, That the following words, "seventeen hundred and fifty pounds current money," be inserted? The yeas and nays being called for by Mr. Norris appeared as follow:
