ment we propose, and no possible mischief can attend the adoption of it that we can conceive. We hope therefore your house will upon reconsideration adopt the amendment, but if you should, not agree to it, return us the bill, and we will pass it in its present form, being satisfied that the buliness of the county courts cannot be conveniently done at their prefent times of fitting the month of March being generally very unfit for attendance at courts, and the general affembly in November interfering with the courts of this month.

Which was read.

The order of the day is postponed till to-morrow morning.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill to repeal part of the act for the better security of government. ORDERED, I hat Mr. Norris, Mr. M'Mechen, and Mr. Ridgely of William, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.
