THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Bowie appeared in the house.

The bill to limit the time of bringing and settling claims against this state, was read the second time and passed. ORDERED, That the said bill be published in the Maryland Gazette and Baltimore Journal eight weeks successively.

The bill to impose duties on certain enumerated articles imported into and exported out of this state; the resolution respecting the prison of Anne-Arundel county; and the bill to limit the time of bringing and settling claims against this state; were sent to the senate by Mr. Seney.

The bill to invest congress with certain powers respecting the commerce of the United States, was read the second time and passed. Sent to the senate by Mr. Graves.

Benedict E. Hall, Esq; from the senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker the bill for the benefit of Mary Fitzhugh, endorsed; "By the senate, January 13, 1785: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Amendment proposed. In the third line from the bottom of the second page, after the word "discharge" insert "in the first instance the other debts due from the estate of the said Daniel, and."

The amendments to the bill to vest certain powers in the intendant of the revenue respecting Nanticoke manor, were read the second time, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill for the discovery of confiscated British property, was read the second time and passed. Sent to the senate by Mr. Oglevee.

The bill to continue the acts of Assembly therein mentioned, was read the second time and passed.

The bill to repeal such part of the acts of assembly therein mentioned as authorized Thomas Contee to collect the debts of William and Robert Mollison, was read the second time and passed.

RESOLVED, That the intendant of the revenue be authorized and directed to employ workmen to make such necessary repairs to the house and garden appropriated for the residence of his excellency the governor, and the roof of the stadt-house, as he may think proper.

The bill to repeal part of the act for the better security of government, was read the second time, and the question put, That the said bill do pass? The yeas and nays being called for by Mr. Miller appeared as follow:
