THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Love. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, Esq; from the senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker a letter from his excellency the governor of Virginia of the first instant, enclosing resolutions of the general assembly of Virginia respecting the navigation of the river Patowmack, endorsed : " By the senate, January 22, 1785: Read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

RESOLVED, That Mr. Frederick Green, printer to this state, be directed to collect and print, in one or more volumes, one hundred copies of all the acts of assembly (now in force) passed since the twenty-sixth of November seventeen hundred and sixty three, to the end of this session of assembly, under the direction of Alexander C. Hanson and Samuel Chafe, Esquires; with the bill of rights, and constitution and form of government, the confederation, and the resolutions of the conventions, and the proceedings of the convention that framed the constitution; at the public expense, and subject to the disposal of the general assembly; and that the intendant of the revenue be directed to advance Mr. Green such a sum of money as he may think proper, to assist him in the execution of the work.

Sent to the senate by Mr. Downes.

On motion, the question was put, That the yeas and nays on the several questions relative to the bill for laying a general tax for the support of the ministers of the gospel of all societies of christians within this state, the resolutions and the address to the people respecting the same, be published in the Annapolis Gazette and Baltimore Journal?
